### What Psychological Mechanisms Lubricate the 'Cultural Ratchet'?

#### Abstract

Cumulative culture – the ratcheting up of knowledge, and iterative improvements in technology over generations – has been proposed to be a uniquely human capability, accounting for the remarkable ecological and demographic success of our species. In this talk I will first describe a series of experiments that compared the performance of a range of primate species with a simple, cumulative puzzle. Secondly, by examining the evidence of the 'ratchet effect' in humans and examine evidence for its existence in other species. I will conclude by considering how the way we define cumulative culture has evolved, and the ramifications of this evolution for the field.
