1st Meeting of the Forum of Parties Involved in the Development of the Basin 18 – 19 January 2012 REPORT OF THE MEETING

Introduction

The first meeting of the Forum of Parties Involved in the Development of the Volta Basin was held in Ouagadougou on $18 - 19^{th}$ January 2012 at the Joly Hotel under the distinguished patronage of the Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the Volta Basin Authority (VBA). The meeting was attended by 4 representatives each from the 6 riparian countries, organizations from the basin, technical and financial partners as well as representatives from the VBA (The attendance list is in Annex 2).

1. Opening Ceremony

The Acting Executive Director of the VBA, Dr. Charles BINEY, the representative of France, Mr. Christophe BARAT (AFD), and Mme Sandrine SANKARA, who represented the Chairman of the VBA Council of Ministers (unable to attend) made speeches during the opening ceremony. The Envoy of the European Commission, also unable to attend, regretted his inability to send a representative.

In his welcome address, the Acting Executive Director underlined the fact that out of the 05 permanent organs as defined by the VBA's convention, which was signed in 2007, the Forum of Parties was the only one which was not yet operational and that the VBA had initiated the operationalisation process in June 2011 by addressing a request to the states to nominate 03 members to constitute, with the National Focal Point, the present Forum of Parties. He then thanked the states for their responses and was also grateful to the Partners, namely- AFD, RIOB, the Seine Normandie Water Agency, the European Union Delegation, and the French Embassy in Burkina – for their financial support, which made it possible to organize this 1st meeting. Finally, he urged the participants to participate actively in the discussions so that the meeting would be a platform for the exchange of ideas to the benefit of the water resources management, and also to the benefit of the socio-economic development of the basin and regional integration.

In his speech, the representative of France was happy that this first meeting of the Forum of Parties Involved in the Development of the Volta Basin had become a reality. He further noted that the event was an important step towards better management of the regional water resources and a sustainable

development in the Volta Basin. Touching on the restructuring process in institutions for basin management, Mr. Christopher BARAT stressed the importance of France's support for the institutional and organizational development of the VBA since its creation, without belittling the important realizations achieved by the VBA up to the holding of the present Stakeholders' Forum, which marks the starting point of the Project on Capacity Building of the Key Organs of the VBA the Forum of Parties, Committee of Experts and Executive Directorate, which was developed in partnership with AFD, the EU Water Facility and the Seine-Normandie Water Agency.

The meeting was then opened with a speech by the representative of the Chairman of the Council of Ministers who underlined the importance of the basin to the 6 states which share it, thereby insisting on the necessity of a concerted management which justifies the setting up of the present "Stakeholders Forum", one of the 5 key organs of the VBA. Before the deliberations began, a general overview of the program (Annex 1) was presented to the participants, and a meeting secretariat established, chaired by the Acting Executive Director of the VBA, Dr. Charles BINEY.

It is also important to note the highly appreciated presence of the President of the Global Water Partnership, West African who exhorted participants to play their roles effectively at the gathering.

Each session was characterized by discussions among the participants who came up with questions, expressed their concerns and/or commented on the subject matters raised in the sessions.

The highlights of the discussions on each session are summarized as follows:

Session	Overview of Session	Summary of Issues raised
Session 1: Presentation of VBA (by the VBA)	The Volta Basin (400 000 km²) is unequally distributed among the six States (Burkina and Ghana account for 83% of the basin area). Numerous activities (economic and strategic) and sustainable development challenges (poverty alleviation, environmental protection) characterise the current management context of the resources of the basin. The establishment of the VBA was facilitated by a favourable environment, international, regional (ECOWAS, AU) and local (OMUS, ABN). The current challenges in the operation of the institution relate to difficulties in mobilising resources (financial and human). Several activities have been undertaken since its establishment including consolidation of its institutional framework and priority technical activities. The VBA has a Strategic Plan based on a Vision, Mission and Specific Objectives. The Forum of Parties is a consultative body; its role in relation to the Executive Directorate and composition are defined in the Statutes of the VBA.	The concerns focused on; The nature and profile of the members of the Forum of Parties, Difficulties in recovering the financial contributions from the States and its consequences on the functioning of the institution, Establishment of national stakeholders' fora. The creation of national stakeholders' fora will thus be subject to payment of financial contributions by VBA Member States especially when only one of the 6 was in good standing.
Session 2: Participative Management, Sharing of Experiences	Three presentations were made during the second session on sharing of experiences in participative management of infrastructure, sub basins and implementation of national policies on water resources management. It may be noted that there are differences in the characteristics of basin organization even in the same countries although their missions remain the same and are based on the following three key principles: - Management by hydrographic basin; - Consultative management; and	The major concerns were on: - Conflict management experiences in the case of Seine-Normandie, - Managing conflicts between the state institutions and Water Agencies (the case of Benin). - Establishment of a follow-up mechanism on performance indicators in the basin.

- The Polluter Pays Principle.

On this occasion, the countries of the Volta Basin learnt from the long experience of the Seine Normandie Water Agency.

It may also be noted that progress in implementing national IWRM policies and participative management in the water sector is quite diversified. However, there have been significant advances in implementation of IWRM policies especially in the elaboration of national IWRM plans and the ongoing institutional reforms.

There were two presentations in this session followed by the feedbacks from the other three countries of the basin.

We can conclude from the two presentations that all the countries are focalizing on how to improve upon water resources management and that the big challenge is how to establish collaboration tools specific to each basin. In this way, the charter is a tool for the harmonisation of water policies within the basin.

In this context, the salient points of the Charters of the ABN and Lake Tchad were presented by Prof. GARANE who made it clear that the charter aims at reinforcing the basic international conventions and that the Charter in itself does not define all the rules on water resources management. Hence, the interest in developing specific annexes.

The proceedings of the day ended with exchanges of ideas on the role of the basins' committees in the elaboration of the Charter. This role, notably as far as the stake holders' forum is concerned, is divided into three components, namely:

- elaboration of the terms of reference,
- definition of the means to be put in place (human, technical and financial),
- definition of the means regarding implementation and operations.

Several questions were asked on the Water Charter. It may be noted that the terms <u>treaty</u>, <u>charter or convention</u> are admissible in international law (of water) with the same compelling characteristics.

On the other hand, non-binding /conventional documents are called declarations or agreements.

Hence the subsequent question on who would be responsible for enforcement of the charter in view of the inability of the countries to conform to its stipulations.

To this question, some proposed the establishment of an inspection mission for ensuring adherence to the obligations of the charter by signatory countries.

On this last point, the exchanges centered on the necessity to put all stakeholders at the same level in terms of existing information and separate the question on the establishment of the Forum from that on the elaboration of the Charter, which will take into consideration the shortcomings of the VBA's convention.

Concerns on the non-ratification of international treaties (1997 United Nations Convention), which governed the adoption of Charters, were discounted because the present Charter will be based on international conventions.

3. Working Session – Day 2

Two sessions were held on the second day as presented below. These were followed by the Closing Ceremony of the Forum.

Session 4 was chaired by Mr. Ben AMPOMAH, National Focal Point of Ghana and also by Dr. Charles BINEY, Ag Executive Director of the VBA. Session 5 was chaired, co-chaired and facilitated by Messrs Charles BINEY and Yao ATIKPO, Executive Director and Deputy Executive Director, respectively.

5. Closing Ceremony

The closing ceremony was marked by statements by the Deputy Permanent Secretary of the International Network of Basin Organizations, Mr. Alain BERNARD, the Regional Advisor of ECOWAS/UEMOA, Mr. Nicolas LECRIVAIN of the French Embassy and the Ag Executive Director of the VBA, Dr. Charles BINEY.

In his address, the RIOB representative noted the already long cooperation between VBA and RIOB and was delighted for the new cooperation up to 2015 through the Water Facility project for the strengthening of VBA's management. He also praised the vision of the founding provisions of the VBA, which include the creation of the Forum of Parties Involved in the Development of the Basin, an advisory body to the Council of Ministers. After congratulating the meeting for the smooth manner in which it was held, which is encouraging for the future of the VBA, he however stressed that while the requirement to concretely involve users, civil society and communities would complicate the process and had its costs, not associating them would be even more costly, thus reiterating the fact that participative management was the best guarantee for a real appropriation of management of water resources and facilitating operational actions; furthermore, he encouraged the VBA to promote the equitable sharing of the benefits of management of water resources and the concerted exploitation of infrastructure. He then concluded by assuring the VBA that it could count on RIOB, RAOB, OIEau and the French Water Agencies to continue to support its actions and urged all participants to prepare to continue the interaction soon in Marseille within the framework of the 6th World Water Forum.

The representative of the French Embassy, Mr. Nicolas LECRIVAIN, then noted and congratulated VBA for the important role it is playing in the regional integration process, which France supports. The Ag executive Director, Dr. Charles BINEY congratulated all for the success of the 1st meeting of the Forum of Parties.
